

GERMAN CARRYING/ PLANS OF ALBERTA MINE IS ARRESTED

Said to Have Been Capitalist
and Well Known in
District

MONTREAL, Sept. 10.—Mystery surrounds the arrest here of a German capitalist from Alberta, 70 years of age, who was apprehended by the detective department acting with the military authorities Saturday last, and taken to the detention hospital, where he underwent a thorough investigation.

The sum of \$75,000 in money and a complete diagram of the Alberta coal mine of which the suspect is said to have been a director until a few weeks ago were found. The man's name was not revealed by the military authorities, but it is understood he had sold out his Alberta interests since the declaration of war, after having resided 15 years in Alberta, and was returning to Germany with the plans. His young niece, who accompanied him, was also taken in charge. They are being held pending orders from Ottawa. The military authorities are reticent when spoken to concerning the disposition of the two.
