

MANY ALIENS REGISTERED.

That the registration of aliens in Montreal is not confined to young reservists or laboring men, was illustrated yesterday afternoon when an elderly and distinguished-looking man, obviously of the wealthier class, pushed his way through the crowd of more than thirty Austrian laborers waiting their turn to be interviewed by the registrar, about four o'clock. This gentleman was subjected to the same catechism as all the aliens from Germany, Austria and Turkey must go through, and affixed his signature to the forms supplied, evidently amused at his predicament. A new regulation has been put in force at the bureau, involving a personal interview between every alien and the chief registrar, Mr. Carpenter, before the registration is made. This makes the progress of the work slower, but men are still flocking to the office in large numbers.
