

With Fatherland, German is Arrested

Traveler for Matches Had In- flammatory Literature; May be Interned

Martin Sichel, 26 Prince Arthur street, Montreal, a so-called Canadianized German, was arrested last night as he got out of the Montreal train at the Union Station, on a charge of having prohibited literature in his possession. Sichel was on his way to Hamilton and had with him a copy of a pro-German paper, The Fatherland, printed in the United States. The issue contained articles upholding the sinking of the Lusitania and other stories detrimental to the cause of the Allies.

Although the man claims that he found the paper in the train, the local police state that the arrest was made on information telegraphed from Montreal. The accused is alleged to have been distributing these pro-German papers in cities in Que-

bec and Ontario. A valise containing a number of letters from people of German parentage living in the United States, was also found on Sichel. The police decline to state what they contain. Sichel is about 25 years of age and is a traveler for the Dominion Match Company of Montreal. He appears in the Police Court to-day and will in all likelihood be turned over to the Registrar of Alien Enemies to be interned.
