

INTERNEED ALIENS BEING DEPORTED

Arrive Here This Morning
From Cobourg and Sail on
the Sicilian

OVERSEAS MEN RETURN

Nearly 150 Officers and Other
Ranks Welcomed at
Bonaventure Station
Yesterday

A party of interned German and other enemy aliens who have been interned near Cobourg during the war years, are due to arrive here this morning on the Canadian Pacific express from Cobourg. They are slated to be returned with thanks to the Fatherland, sailing for England today by the Sicilian, and will be sent on to Germany from Liverpool. The party will be kept under guard while here, and escorted to the vessel for trans-shipment. Included in the party of enemy aliens are several rated as insane, who are being sent overseas under guard. During the period between their arrival here and their embarkation on the Sicilian, they will be in charge of Capt. J. N. Carter, at the alien enemies' quarters at 172 St. Antoine street.

SOLDIERS WELCOMED HOME.

There was a large crowd at the Bonaventure station at 11.30 yesterday morning when a party of 32 officers and 82 other ranks arrived, with 32 convalescent patients for the military hospital at Ste. Anne de Bellevue. The train arrived on time, and was met by a guard of honor and band from the 4th C. G. R., with a number of officers from Headquarters, and representatives of the K. of C., the Y.M.C.A. and Salvation Army.

Immediately on detraining the troops, comprising details from various overseas units, marched up Windsor street to the Peel street barracks, where they were quickly demobilized.

The party of convalescents proceeded later to St. Anne, where they were looked after at the military hospital, and those medically fit given the usual furlough.

The Winifredian is due at Halifax on Saturday next with 11 officers and 183 other ranks for Montreal, details from various overseas units. They will probably arrive here some time on the 28th.

The Regina is due to dock at Halifax early this morning, while a hospital transport will arrive at Portland either today or tomorrow morning.
