

ENEMIES IN CAMP

Will Be Set to Clearing Land for Agriculture

Captain G. A. Dillon, of the 55th Irish-Canadian Rangers, returned yesterday to the city from Spirit Lake, P.Q., where the Government has established a military camp for the internment of a number of alien enemies. Captain Dillon said that the total number of prisoners now there is 161. They are in charge of Major Rodden, who has a company of sixty men under his command. The Austrians and others, said Capt. Dillon, are taking their situation philosophically. They will go into permanent hut dwellings early next week. The soldiers are living in box cars, which have been made as comfortable as conditions would permit.

Another batch of 100 prisoners will leave next week for Spirit Lake, in charge of Captain Dillon, and a squad of soldiers. It is the intention of the Government to continue sending war prisoners to this place until the number shall have reached one thousand. These men will, as soon as the plans of the Government can be arranged, be put upon the land and given an opportunity to create an agricultural centre in that district.
