

Nickel Refining Company to Erect Big Plant

The British-Canadian Refining Company have been granted a lease by the Ontario Government for the development of power on the Wahnapitae River, to be used in connection with their proposed smelting works near Sudbury. The Hon. G. Howard Ferguson, who made the announcement yesterday, declared that four or five million dollars will be invested in the property, but he is not ready yet to announce the terms of the lease.
