

ARRESTED AS SPIES

**Germans Are Taken Into Custody in
 Nova Scotia—Assistant Manager of
 Chateau Frontenac at Quebec**

HALIFAX, N. S., Aug. 12.—Three Germans were taken prisoners this morning by three Halifax officers on the charge of being spies. The Germans got on the train at Hubbards, and the officers were on the same train. The baggage of the suspects was stopped. Papers and various plans are said to confirm the suspicion that the Germans were acting as spies along the southern shore of Nova Scotia. The prisoners will be brought to Halifax tonight. A suspicious character has also been arrested at Guysboro as a spy.

QUEBEC, Aug. 10.—Assistant Manager Lobbe, of the Chateau Frontenac, was arrested this morning as a German reservist. He was released on condition that he will report himself to the Militia Department each morning. Lobbe was once a captain in the German army.
