

Spy Had Chart of Harbor at Quebec

*While Working for Commis-
sioners There He Ordered
Photos Taken*

Quebec, Nov. 18.—That F. G. Hoffman, arrested in Winnipeg on a charge of spying in Canada for the German Government, had copies of charts giving full data for the safe navigation of the harbor of Quebec, was made known this afternoon when the photographic department of Livernois Studios, this city, established from their collection of plates that Hoffman, while he was in the employ of the Quebec Harbor Commission had ordered copies of a blue-print chart of the harbor from Sillery to the Island of Orleans.

It is not known yet whether these negatives were used to make a number of copies for the personal use of Hoffman, as he was at liberty, as a draughtsman for the Commissioners to go through all the documents belonging to that body, and who, furthermore, had the initiative of ordering copies of blue prints, charts, or whatever document he saw fit without control.
