Internment of another former German officer. Herr Willy Baubacher, general manager of the Price Brothers' pulp mills at Rimouski, has been made after investigation of the case by the officers of the Bureau for Registration of Alien Enemies

Following the arrest of S. H. Mundhelm, the German manager of the Cement Products Company of Canada, whose plant is on the Island of Orleans, special care has been exercised

with regard to the surveillance of Germans holding important executive positions in this country, and Mr. C. G. Ogden, K.C., who is now directing the registration bureau, aside from his legal practice, decided after investigation of Baubacher's case that his position was to some extent equivocal

and that internment would be the simplest method of handling the case. Baubacher was according brought

from Rimouski, and has been sent with Mundheim to Fort Henry, King-While Mr. Ogden declined to discuss Baubacher's case yesterday, he implied that no very definite suspicion of the man was entertained by the authorities, as there had been of Mundheim, but that the necessity of his leaving the employ of Messrs. Price Brothers made his internment preferable to any other course that might have been adopted. Baubacher came to Canada several years ago and is a mining engineer.
