

SUFFOLK HERE WITH PRISONERS OF WAR

The British cruiser Suffolk arrived in Halifax harbor yesterday afternoon with twenty-seven prisoners of war on board. The Germans were taken off a steamer five miles outside of New York harbor. All of them were reservists. There were several officers in the party.

The prisoners were transferred from the Suffolk to the S. S. Alfreda and taken round to Melville Island where they were united with their fellow-countrymen there.

This makes the second batch of prisoners within a week. Three German deserters were brought to Melville Island last week.
