

ALIEN MINERS MUST QUIT WORK

**Men in Albion Mine Refused to
Work With Austrians and
Germans.**

WESTVILLE, June 28—Three hundred and fifty-five men who work in the Albion mine of the Acadia Coal Company, signed a petition requesting the dismissal of the Austrian and German workmen, with the result that their wishes have been met. It was thought that the presence of the aliens was a constant danger to the lives of those in sympathy with the success of the Allies because of some act that might be committed to further the German cause.

The Allan shaft, which was closed because of an explosion for some time is now working as formerly. Coal is being taken from the mine in large quantities and the mine is entirely safe.

The Cumming plant at New Glasgow, which was put out of commission by a fire supposed to have been of incendiary origin, has been repaired, and will be turning out shells again this week. They now have an order for shells that will keep them busy for at least six months.
