

WILL MAKE HIS HOME ON BRITISH CRUISER

Duke of Connaught Arrives in Halifax and Goes Aboard War- ship—Returns Saturday.

Halifax, N.S., Aug. 23.—The Duke of Connaught and staff arrived in the city this morning by special train. The governor-general was met by Lieut.-Governor McKeen and staff, the senior admiral of the port and his staff, Col. Thompson and his staff, Mayor Martin, and a guard of honor composed of one hundred sturdy sailors of one of His Majesty's warships. His Royal Highness went aboard one of His Majesty's cruisers. He will live on the ship during his stay here. The entire morning was devoted to an inspection of the various ships of war in the harbor and the harbor fortifications.

This afternoon he made an inspection of the internment camp and the German prisoners at the citadel. He will review two hundred scouts and hold an inspection of the administrative officers of the Patriotic Fund later.

Thursday will be given up to an inspection of military forts, islands and military establishments on shore. There will be a naval inspection Friday morning and a garden party in honor of His Royal Highness at Maplewood in the afternoon, to which a very large number of invitations have been issued. At 11:30 p.m., he will entrain for Aldershot, where the Nova Scotia Highland brigade will be inspected on Saturday. The Duke leaves for Ottawa Saturday afternoon.
