

# WANT PRODUCER AND CONSUMER TO MEET

## Chilliwack Board of Trade Endorses Resolution Re Vancouver Market.

CHILLIWACK, Sept. 4.—At the meeting of the Board of Trade on Wednesday evening Mr. W. L. Mackin reported that he had taken up the matter of the proposed internment camp at Chilliwack with the authorities, and judging from the correspondence he was satisfied that nothing would be done in this respect at present.

In reply to the request of the board for additional lights at Cheam avenue crossing the B. C. Electric Company wrote to the effect that they did not consider more lights necessary, and at any rate if they complied with the wish of the board it would mean numerous applications from other points for lights also.

The following resolution was received from the Port Hammond Board of Trade for endorsement:

"That Vancouver Board of Trade take up the matter of regulating the City Market so as to facilitate meeting of producer and consumer."

After some discussion as to how the proposed change would affect Chilliwack it was decided to endorse the resolution.

Mr. King drew attention to the fact that the City Beautiful Association had erected hitching posts where horses could be tied up instead of being left standing on the street. A number of farmers had not yet taken advantage of this convenience, and he thought it was only necessary to acquaint them with the fact.

A subject which merited considerable discussion was initiated by Mr. Burton in connection with the equipment, tools and utensils used in the Technical school. Mr. Burton contended that two-thirds of the tools used in the school were of foreign manufacture, and it seemed to him that this was against the propaganda carried on by the government and a number of other institutions to further the buying of home manufactured goods. "How can we expect to sell home-made goods if our children are taught in our schools to use the imported product?" asked Mr. Burton. Eventually a committee consisting of Messrs. W. L. Mackin, I. Burton and G. H. W. Ashwell was appointed to go into the matter with the school board.
