

ARRIVES TO TAKE OVER COMMAND

Lieutenant-Colonel Gregory Will Have Charge of Troops in Training at Vernon Camp.

Lieut.-Colonel F. W. Gregory, camp commandant for the Vernon military training camp, arrived in Vancouver this morning and will leave to take charge of the troops at Vernon, with Colonel Duff-Stuart, tonight. Colonel Gregory, who is a St. Catharines man, is the commandant of the 1st Militia Brigade of Ontario. He has acted as commandant of the internment camp at Petawawa, and was transferred from that post to the British Columbia camp.

Colonel Duff-Stuart, who leaves tonight for Vernon with Lieut.-Colonel Gregory, has announced some of the appointments for the Vernon camp. Captain Major, of the 7th Battalion, has been appointed orderly officer; Capt. Gilliat, of the 16th, is appointed G. S. O.; Capt. Turnbull, 50th Gordon Highlanders, will act as D. A. A. and Q. M. G.; Major Small, of the 41st Battalion, is to be A. D. S. T.; and Capt. Cummings, of the C. A. M. C., will act at A. D. M. S. The musketry instructor will be Colonel Cartwright, of Summerland. Signalling officer's work will be carried on by Captain Lee, of the district headquarters staff, and Lieut. McDonald, of the ordnance department at Victoria, will act as ordnance officer.

Other junior appointments have still to be made, and there are vacancies for several clerical positions, which will be filled from applicants. Colonel Stuart will probably return to Vancouver toward the close of the week.
