

INTERNED GERMAN FACES CHARGE OF MANSLAUGHTER

VERNON, B. C., Oct., 31.—At the assizes which opened here yesterday before Mr. Justice McDonald, Karl Wagner, an interned German prisoner, is being tried on a charge of manslaughter, amended by the grand jury from the original indictment for murder. On July 8 a quarrel occurred in the Vernon Internment Camp between Wagner and another prisoner named Leo Mueller. In the fight Mueller's neck was broken and he died three days later.

The only other important case on the calendar is a charge of cattle stealing against three men from Princeton. Deputy Attorney General Johnson arrived yesterday to conduct this prosecution.
