

Stop Teaching of German in Brandon

Language of High Kultur Struck Off Collegiate Curriculum

Brandon, Oct. 19.—That the teaching of the German language in the Brandon Collegiate Institute, will be discontinued was the decision arrived at by the educational authorities at the last meeting of the Board. Those pupils who are finishing a course in German will be permitted to do so, but the teaching of this branch of the curriculum will be discontinued.

In a report to the School Board, Principal McDougall explained that in the past German had been the ground of the second year. This year, he said, for obvious reasons, no provision had been made for it. Botany was the optional subject which he thought would be of more use.

"This is not through any feeling of vindictiveness," continued the Principal, "but I think that for some years there will be no further use for German. Students who started their second year German last year are, of course, finishing their third year, but next year there will be no German at all."
