

ESPIONAGE CHARGED AGAINST TWO GERMANS

ONE OF MEN ARRESTED AT
NIPIGON HAD SERVED IN
GERMAN NAVY.

Port Arthur, Ont., March 21.—Carl Schmidt and Gustaff Stephens, the two Germans arrested after they had excited suspicion by their actions at Nipigon; have been charged with being **alien enemies** engaged in espionage, a crime punishable by death. They have been remanded for a week. Schmidt was in the German navy and came to the United States five years ago. He is thirty-five years of age, lives in Detroit and has a wife and three children. Stephens is unmarried. The prisoners' finger-prints were taken and forwarded to Ottawa.

NAVIGATION PROSPECTS.

Sarnia, March 21.—(Special.)—The White Star Line steamer Wauketa will open freight and passenger navigation on the St. Clair River and Lake on March 28. This boat is the earliest passenger steamer to start each season. Ice conditions between here and Detroit are still bad. The steamer Inland of the S. C. S. L. will be brought here from Goderich on the opening of navigation and will be placed in the Reid drydock for repairs.
