

38 I. W. W. ALIENS ARE HELD BY THE MILITARY

Brought to London Under a Heavy Guard Following Windsor Disturbances.

London, Ont., June 19.—Thirty-eight foreigners arrested in connection with the I. W. W. demonstration at Windsor on Tuesday were brought to the London Armouries under heavy guard to-day. The men are being held here pending instructions from the military authorities.

Lieut.-Col. W. J. Brown, Adjutant-General of Military District No. 1, accompanied by Major John Hirst, the Provost Marshal Hirst, of London, trict, are at Windsor, and the 1st Battalion, Canadian Garrison Regiment is standing under arms awaiting a call to the border city if further trouble among the foreign I. W. W. element breaks out there.

Alien Menace in Windsor.

Windsor, Ont., June 19.—Drastic action has been taken by the Government authorities to end the alien enemy menace in this district. Thirty-eight of the Russians arrested Tuesday in this city as violators of the Military Service Act were sent to London early this morning by order from Ottawa. They were in charge of an armed guard, commanded by Provost Marshal Hirst, of London. The authorities intend, it is said, to put them in uniform.

At a meeting Tuesday in Ford, alien residents of that town decided not to return to work until the release of Perehuda and his followers was ordered. They, however, promised to comply with the Registration Act, and arrangements have been made to register them to-day at the Town Hall, Ford.
