

# Take 120 Internes From Camp Here

One hundred and twenty internes from the camp here have been sent to Calgary from where they will proceed to the National Park at Banff to take in the magnificent scenery of the mountains. While at Banff they will not stay at the C.P.R. hotel, but will camp in the woods close to nature. They will be on the road considerably.

In two batches of 60 each, Capt. Birnie, head of the internment camp here, has escorted the Austrians to Calgary from where they will be sent to work on the roads at Banff. The German prisoners have not been sent probably because it is considered safer to have them behind barbed wire fences. The number remaining here is about 170 and there are several added almost every day.

It is possible that more internes may be sent north but it is almost certain that this is merely a temporary arrangement and that with the return of the cold weather they will be sent back to Lethbridge.
