IMMIGRATION DEPARTMENT AND THE BELLINGHAM RIOTS.

The Seven Hundred and Fifty Men
Heading for Canada Will be
Treated in Precisely the Same
Way as Any Other Would-be
Settlers.

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)
Ottawa, Sept. 6.—The Dominion Gov-

ernment has had no information cerning the report that 750 Hindus are on their way from Bellingham, in Washington Territory, for British Columbia, nor as to the raid upon Hindus in Bel-The only thing that Canada lingham, can do to prevent Hindus arriving in Canada is to apply to them the terms of the immigration act in the same way as to other British subjects. to say, if there are any undesirables among the Hindus they will be deported. Any of them suffering from disease or likely to become a public charge on the community will not be allowed to land in Canada. Beyond this, which is applicable to British subjects as well as foreigners, there arc no restrictions upon Hindu immigration. The immigration department has no information on

the matter.
