

## EVIDENCE AT GLACE BAY.

### Men Leave Mines for Less Dangerous Work—The Conciliation Board.

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)

Hallfax, March 9.—The Conciliation Board which has been in session at Glace Bay during the past week concluded the work of taking evidence this afternoon. Among the witnesses heard during the morning were Manager Maxwell, No. 1. and underground manager Munroe of Dominion No. 1. It is learned that Mr. Maxwell stated that while the company paid a good rate of wages to the men it had no difficulty in securing sufficient labor, and that foreigners and other laborers left here because they could get better wages at the less dangerous work of railway construction. Members of the board, with representatives of the Coal Company and P. W. A., will sit to-morrow privately to consider the evidence, and a decision will likely be arrived at within a few days. The sittings of the board showed both employees and officers of the Coal Company in a most favorable light, everyone who was called as a witness being thoroughly acquainted with the position.

A by-law is being prepared to enforce the placing of fire escapes upon all such public buildings. The meeting was quite brief owing to the illness of Mayor Campbell, whose chair was occupied by Ald. Southcott.
