

# Immigration Policy For Ontario

Premier Whitney left on August 10 for a six weeks' visit to England. He will sail by the Mauretania from New York, and may be expected in Toronto again about the end of next month.

Sir James is going on official business and will be joined a week later by Hon. Nelson Monfeth. Since the change in dealing with immigration, by which the Dominion Government takes control of the distribution of arrivals in this country, the altered circumstances require a new policy on the part of the province. This will be looked into in England by Sir James and the minister of agriculture. It is the design of the Ontario Government to select a better class of emigrants in England, and as far as possible direct them to Ontario for settlement.

To this end a permanent office will be established in London. It is probable that the Strand will be chosen as the best situation for these. The new building of the C.P.R. may yield the necessary accommodation, but nothing has been settled.
