

SHOCKING STATE OF AFFAIRS EXISTS IN TORONTO THE GOOD

Police Made a Round up on
King St. Saturday Night and
Details Unmentionable.

OFFICIALS COULDN'T
STAND IT THEMSELVES

130 Men and Two Women
Occupied One House and
Conditions Found.

Toronto, March 17.—As an outcome of the revelations made at the Amy Stein inquest Friday night the police made a thorough investigation of the district on King street, on both sides from Berkley to Sackville. Saturday night, in search of women of ill repute, who visit these places for immoral purposes, and the sights witnessed were sickening.

The search lasted from 9 p.m. Saturday until 3 a.m. Sunday, and in all some fifty places were visited. In many of the places men were huddled together in heaps, some asleep on the floor, and many of them playing cards, and the conditions of the rooms was such that Inspector Allison and his staff could not go through more than two houses without seeking fresh air.

A naverage of 70 or 80 roomers was found in each building, but a previous search led to the discovery of 130 men and two women under one roof. In another house in the French district some girls were found with 150 Macedonians, while a girl who had recutly been charged with vagrancy was discovered in a house from which she had been taken, accompanied by her two sisters, aged nine and eleven years.
