FIVE THOUSAND IMMIGRANTS PASS THROUGH TORONTO

AND TWELVE HUNDRED FARM-ERS AROUND THE CITY WOULD LIKE THEM TO STOP.

Five thousand immigrants from England and Scotland, who were delayed by fog below Quebec for several days, passed through the city yesterday. Nine special trains were pressed into service by the railway companies to rush the newcomers through to their destinations in the west to go on farms. It is the biggest consignment of the year. About ten per cent. of the arrivals stopped off at Toronto. These were mostly mechanics. There was a very small percentage of foreigners on the trains.

Officers of the Dominion Immigra-tion Department at the Union Station say that the bookings by the steam-ship companies are exceptionally heavy, and, according to latest re-ports, it is estimated that about thirty thousand immigrants will be brought to Canada during the month, which will be about eleven thousand in excess of the figures for April. Many of the new arrivals prefer going on farms, and they have no trouble in getting employment. The records at the local immigration of-fices show that our twelve hundred farmers are registered as wanting
