

NEW SEPARATE SCHOOL CATHOLIC CHURCH AND CONVENT FOR WEST END

ALL CAPTAINS OF 51ST SAULT RIFLES PASSED THE EXAMS.

Major Campbell Received a
Telegram from Sergeant-
Major Utton.

ONLY SCHOOL WHERE 100 PER CENT. PASSED

Colonel and Major Are Al-
lowed a Year to
Qualify.

Major C. V. Campbell, of the 51st
Soo Rifles, received today the follow-
ing telegram from Sergeant-Major
Utton, who was in charge of the
School of Instruction for the officers
here:

"Rejoice! all passed for captains
successfully. Notify Colonel and
others."

The Star is informed that this is
the first provisional school on record
where 100 per cent. of those attend-
ing passed successfully. That the
subalterns and N. C. O.'s all passed
was announced some days ago.

The colonel and the major will now
receive captain's papers, but will act
in their provisional positions and are
given a query to qualify. They can-
not qualify for the majority and the
colonelcy at the provisional school,
but must attend the training school
at Toronto.

WAS NOT VICTIM OF TORONTO FIRE

Bishop Scollard Purchased
Property While Here
Some Time Ago.

PROVIDE FOR ITALIAN AND POLISH PEOPLE

Although All Other Nation-
alities are Expected to
Attend Institutions.

Following yesterday's announcement
of the sale of debentures for the Steel-
ton Harris and Buckley Public school
comes the announcement that Bishop
D. J. Scollard, of Sault Ste. Marie, had
purchased an acre and a quarter of
land, surrounded by streets on four
sides, in Harris and Buckley, when in
the Sault a few weeks ago, for the
blessing and opening of St. Mary's
School on James street.

Within the very near future, it is
Bishop Scollard's intention to erect
a Catholic Church and Separate school
on this plot of land. Both the church
and school will be for attendance by
all nationalities. It is the intention of
Bishop Scollard to provide in that dis-
trict for the Italian and Polish popu-
lation by this means.

The church will be quite large and
of a handsome architectural plan,
while the school will be built some-
what on the plan of the St. Mary's
school.

Nuns will have charge of the school,
it being likely that they will be of
the Order of St. Joseph, who already
have charge of all the Separate schools
here in which nuns are located. Bis-
hop Scollard intends to erect a con-
vent on this block of land for the nuns
if Harris and Buckley progresses as
it has been doing in the past year.
This step will likely be taken within a
year or so.

This large purchase of land, from
Mr. George Carufel, by Bishop Scollard
has made it possible that all the build-
ings and connections of the Catholic
Church may be assembled in one por-
tion of the sub-division.
