

DEMONSTRATION BY UNEMPLOYED IN CITY OF EDMONTON

Thousand Gathered and Sang Several Revolutionary Songs.

Edmonton, May 12.—The unemployed, headed by organizers of the I. W. W., are again becoming a troublesome element to the police. They held a demonstration on the Market square, where two thousand people gathered and sang the Marseillaise and other revolutionary songs.

Today another big parade is being arranged and delegations will wait upon the civic and provincial governments, demanding that they be given work. Employment agencies for the various railways say there is very little work offering at the present time, but a number of men will be required in the course of a few weeks.
