## MOBILIZATION ORDERS FOR AUSTRIANS IN CANADA

150,000 AUSTRIANS IN THE DOMIN-ION WHO WILL BE NOTIFIED.

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

Winnipeg, July 28.—A partial mobilization order in connection with the Austro-Servian war has been issued, to apply in western Canada. The order is dated July 26. Gorge Reininghaus, Austrian Consul, said to-day that there are 150,000 Austrians in western Canada, and those concerned would be notified individually by letter that their corps has been ordered to the front.

Proclamations as to mobilization will be published in the German and Ruthenian newspapers of the west to-morrow. The Winnipeg Consulate has jurisdiction over Austrian interests in the three prairie Provinces, there being an honorary Consulate in Vancouver for British Columbia.

There are also a large number of Serbs in the west, but there is no

Consul at Winnipeg.

## HAY CROP BURNED.

Cobourg, July 28.—Fire got a start in a field of hay belonging to Mr. Thomas Haig, Seymour, causing the loss of the crop, fences and several implements.

## STATE PRISON ON FIRE.

Concord, N.H., July 28.—One threman was killed and two others were injured yesterday during a fire at the State prison which destroyed three stories and the lumber piles of the Granite State Manufacturing Company, which manufactures chairs by convict labor. Amos Turner lost his life when a pile of lumber on which ha was warking fell in and burisal him.
