

# CALL TO AUSTRIANS ISSUED IN WINNIPEG

The official proclamation of the partial mobilization order issued by the government of Austria-Hungary was published in Winnipeg yesterday in "The Ukrainian Voice" and other papers of the nationalities concerned. German is the official language of Austria, but about 10 languages are spoken by the people within the boundaries of the empire. Consequently, the proclamation of the partial mobilization appears in the two German papers of Winnipeg, in the seven Ruthenian and in the one Hungarian paper of the west.

The men concerned in the mobilization are being informed by announcement cards, in addition to the mobilization orders. The order promises that expenses of travelling will be paid, and this will make considerable difference in the number returning, as it is considered that many of the men, in these hard times, are too poor to bear their own expenses.

When the expenses are to be paid, and even advanced to those unable to meet them at the moment, it is expected that a large number of the men will respond to the call to arms.

The Austrian proclamation issued from the local consulate is an interesting document, and as published in the papers yesterday reads as follows:
