AUSTRIANS IN BRANTFORD ASKED TO BE READY

A LOCAL REPRESENTATIVE AP-POINTED TO ENROLL THOSE WILLING TO FIGHT.

(Special Despatch to The Globe.) Brantford, July 31 .- Precautionary measures are being taken by Austria-Hungary in regard to mobilization of Austrians resident in Canada. David Katz, 31 Pearl street, is in receipt of a communication from the Austrian-Hungarian Consul at Montreal appointing him the local representative. and requesting all Austrians and Hungarians here. numbering one thousand, to remain during the present crisis in their present residence. the object being to make possible a hurried rally of a Canadian contingent to leave for the front if the conditions in Europe so demand.

Mr. Katz stated last night that the local Austrians were prepared and willing to go to fight for their fatherland, and would leave at short notice for the front.
