## TRANSPORTATION OF RESERVISTS A PROBLEM

## AUSTRIANS IN AMERICA MAY FIND IT DIFFICULT TO GET AWAY.

(Canadian Press Despatch.) New York, Aug. 2.-The perplexing problem of transporting hundreds of reservists and volunteers for military service in the Austro-Hungarian army to-day confronted Acting Consul-General Winter. Acting under orders from the Vienna Government all temporary arrangements for sending reservists to Austria were suspended Friday. About 706 Austrians are in the city, and it has been arranged to begin assigning them to steamships.

As a last resort in getting Austrian reservists and volunteers to the scene of the war it was rumored that the men might be sent to the West Indies, where several German warships are stationed.
