

GERMAN CLASHES WITH A CANADIAN ON STREET CORNER

British Subjects Have Hot Argument Near Journal Bulletin Board

"While you are in Canada, while you are living on British soil, and while you are receiving the protection of the British flag, don't cry down the empire, at least, do not decry the flag on a public thoroughfare where you are likely to be heard by loyal British subjects." Putting all the emphasis behind his words possible, and yelling so that he could be heard by all the crowd, the foregoing was what a Canadian said during an altercation with a German in the crowd of anxious war news seekers assembled in front of The Journal's bulletin board at the corner of 101st street and Jasper today.

The Canadian—small in stature compared with his rival—was cheered heartily by the crowd, and so hostile did the people become toward the German that it was necessary for him to beat a hasty retreat. That the son of the kaiser had "opened his mouth a little too wide" was the expression heard from several persons. The spokesman said that it was only right at such a time for a man to be loyal to the land of his birth, but it was not right, while a German was on British soil, to decry the land and the people from whom he was getting his living and protection.
