GERMANY ISSUES CALL.

Reservists in Canada Ordered to Join Colors.

Mr. J. Henry Peters, German Consul for Ontario, issued the following bulletin yesterday afternoon:

"It is officially declared by the German Consul for Ontario that Germany is mobilizing and calling all reservists to report for duty. There is no information whatever about any war having been declared by Germany."

German reservists in the Province regard this notice as a call to join the colors.
