O FURTHER LEAVE FOR MONTREAL POLICE

(Special Despatch to The Globe.) Montreal, Aug. 5 .- Police Campeau stated that until further oriers no leave of absence would granted, except for those who wish to fight for Great Britain or her allies. Those now on leave are being recalled. The Chief, in an interview, explained that there are thousands of foreigners in Montreal whose sympathies are not with Britain, therefore it has been decided to keep close watch upon all public buildings works. The police will not allow recruiting here for the German or Austrian armies. It was stated here -tonight that Austro-Hungarians who are unable to leave Canada have been advised by their Consulate to stay quietly here, and not to take part in any demonstration.
