

FOREIGN RESERVISTS SHUT UP IN CANADA

**No Steamers to Take Austrians
and Germans Away if Govern-
ment Allowed Departure.**

Ottawa, Aug. 5.—It will be scarcely necessary for the government to make any regulations forbidding the departure from Canada of Austrians and German reservists, who may desire to go to help these countries in the great war proceeding. With all sailing across the Atlantic from Canadian ports completely stopped these men could not leave Canada, even if they wished to. It is, of course, possible that they could proceed via the United States by United States vessels, though it is believed that the United States might place technical difficulties in the way of their crossing the border.

It is even doubtful whether the government would take any action to stop the departure of these men via the United States. It is realized that their absence from Canada at the present juncture would be preferable to their presence.

There are large numbers of Austrians in Ottawa at present. A few days ago two hundred of them stopped work on the new rifle ranges with the intention of going home. Their numbers have been supplemented by a large number who were in the employ of J. R. Booth in the woods.
