

# PREVENT RESERVISTS LEAVING DOMINION

## The Government is Keeping Strict Watch for Acts of Espionage.

In accordance with instructions received from the Imperial authorities German officers or reservists attempting to leave Canada for the purpose of joining their colors will be arrested and detained. Arrangements for this purpose have been made at all ocean ports on the Atlantic and the Pacific as well as at the various cities and towns.

German immigrants desiring to remain in Canada for the purpose of continuing or attending to their ordinary business or avocations will not be molested or interfered with unless they engage in espionage or in any hostile act or attempt or unless they endeavor to give information or aid to the enemy or otherwise contravene any law, order-in-council or proclamation.

German immigrants so peaceably and quietly conducting themselves

and not engaging in any such unlawful acts, are entitled to the protection of the law and the government express the earnest hope that no attempt will be made to molest or interfere with them.

### RELEASE GERMAN AT BERLIN

By the order of the minister of militia, a German army reservist who was arrested at Berlin yesterday afternoon, without real apparent cause, has been released. The matter was brought to the attention of the militia department by Mr. Weichel, M.P., and it was represented that the man did not intend to leave the country, but was anxious to become a Canadian citizen.

It is understood that there are a large number of German reservists in Canada who have no intention or desire to go back to the Fatherland to fight and who are allowing themselves to be put under arrest as a means of staying in Canada while at the same time doing their duty to their country. It is possible the Berlin case comes under this head.

### Russian Brigade's Losses.

BERLIN, via London, August 7.—11.45 p.m.—A Russian cavalry brigade this morning attacked the German troops near Soldau, in East Prussia. The attack was repulsed with considerable losses.

Russian cavalry on Thursday attacked the town of Kibarty, near Wirballen, in the government of Suwalka, Russian Poland.
