Not Many Foreigners Leaving the Sault. There have not been a great many foreigners leave the Sault on account of the war. A few Austrians have left during the last couple of weeks, most of them were army reservists that were going home on funds provided by the Austrian government. The majority of the people from Russia in the Sault are Pinlanders, and among them there is quite a feeling in favor of Germany as opposed to Russia, which has oppressed them considerably in the past.

As Italy has not yet been drawn into the war, there have been tew, if any, Italians leave here on account of the fighting, and among the Italians here the feeling favors Britain rather than her opponents. No love for Austria is displayed.

Now, of course, none but British, Canadian and American subjects are allowed to book ocean passage from Canada.
