

LUMBERING CALLS FOREIGNERS AWAY

Many Have Left the Sault Every Day This Week.

A week ago numerous idle foreigners were in evidence about the streets of the city, but during the past two or three days the number has been fewer.

Every day for the past five days from 20 to 80 and 90 foreigners, mostly Italians, have been shipped out of the Sault by the local employment agencies to Blind River and Thessalon, where they are going into the lumber camps for the winter.

Thessalon has issued a call for 1,000 lumbermen, and other towns along the line that subsist on the lumbering business are also making a large demand for men.

Many of the foreigners who have been laid off by the Lake Superior Corporation are taking advantage of this employment, and their absence from the streets and the park in front of the Court House is thus accounted for.
