## <mark>AUSTRIAN</mark> RESERVISTS ARE HELD AT SARNIA

TAKEN OFF G. T. R. TRAINS FROM MILWAUKEE BOUND FOR NEW YORK.

(Special Despatch to The Giobs.) 24.--Ten Sarnia, Aug. are locked up at the police stations as prisoners of war. The men army reservists, and were on their way back to the old country. This is the first time in the history of this port that anyone has been held as a prisoner of war. The men Were from the taken off trains Saturday night and yesterday. They hail from Chicago and Milwaukee. and all purchased their tickets in the last named city. It is expected that more reservists will be taken off train from Chicago to-day.

Those at the police station do not radize their predicament. They do not understand that by purchasing tickets on the Grand Trunk, to connect with New York sailings, they placed themselvs in the hands of their enemy by entering Canada. One of the reservists stated that his home in the old country had been burned down, and that his wife and children were homeless.

It is likely that the men will be sent through to Toronto, to be held there until after the war is over.

## NOONDAY PRAYER FOR PEACE.
