

HUNDRED PRISONERS AT FORT HENRY

They Are German and Austrian
Reservists Arrested In
Canada

OTTAWA, August 31—There are now over one hundred German and Austrian reservists incarcerated in Fort Henry at Kingston, and the numbers are increasing daily. These prisoners of war have nearly all been turned over to the military authorities by immigration inspectors and officials. They were arrested in accordance with the recent general order while attempting to make their way into the United States by crossing the border at Niagara, Windsor and other points.

Many of those so far arrested have been armed with revolvers, and there is now quite a collection of these weapons in the possession of the department.

Little trouble has, however, been experienced in the arrests. Many of those taken appearing to be glad of the excuse which their arrest gave them of escaping the enforced military service in Germany or Austria. Quite a number have been arrested at the western border towns.
