

RESERVISTS OF GERMANY LEFT CANADA BEFORE WAR BROKE OUT

Kaiser's Men Seem to Have Been Better Acquainted With European Conditions Than Austrians.

RESERVISTS HELD HERE ARE MOSTLY AUSTRIANS

About 500 Austrian and German Reservists Are Still in Canadian Prisons.

There are now only about 500 German and Austrian reservists detained in Canadian prisons. Over two hundred of these are at Kingston. Some thousands of German and Austrian reservists, who were arrested, have been allowed out on parole. These have undertaken to go about their business peacefully, and to make no attempt to remove beyond the confines of Canada.

Mostly Austrians.

Of the 500 who are still in the various detention places throughout Canada most are Austrians. It seems that the German reservists, who had come to Canada to settle, were better acquainted with the situation in Europe than the Austrians, and even before war was declared they had begun to proceed to Europe.

Germans Left Early.

Several thousands of Germans—it is not known just how many—left the country for the Fatherland before the government took steps to prevent their leaving.
