27 WILL BE BROUGHT TO DE-TENTION CAMPS IN CANADA.

(Canadian Press Despatch.) New York, Sept. 18 .- The Dutch steamer Commewijne, from Cartagena and other ports in South nnd Central America, was stopped searched off Ambrose Channel lightship this forenoon by the British cruiser Lancaster. Twenty-seven men the British officers devided were German reservists, and were off the ship and transferred to cruiser.

Those arrested were discharged employees of the Hamburg-American Line steamers Albingia, Mecklenburg and Virginia, which are interned at Cartagena. The prisoners were informed that they would probably be sent to detention camps in Canada.
