
GERMANS ARE ARRESTED ON A DUTCH STEAMER

27 WILL BE BROUGHT TO DETENTION CAMPS IN CANADA.

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

New York, Sept. 18.—The Dutch steamer *Commewijne*, from Cartagena and other ports in South and Central America, was stopped and searched off Ambrose Channel lightship this forenoon by the British cruiser *Lancaster*. Twenty-seven men the British officers decided were German reservists, and were taken off the ship and transferred to the cruiser.

Those arrested were discharged employees of the Hamburg-American Line steamers *Albingia*, *Mecklenburg* and *Virginia*, which are interned at Cartagena. The prisoners were informed that they would probably be sent to detention camps in Canada.
