

A session of the County Court was held in this city on Thursday and Friday of last week; Judge Swanson presiding. A large number of applications for naturalization were presented to the court, amongst them being a few by Germans and Austrians. These His Honor refused to grant at the present time but gave leave to have them placed before him at some future date. There were a number of cases on the docket wherein the defendants were members of the militia; and all these the Judge ordered to be stood over as he would not consent to give judgment when such conditions existed. An action brought by A. E. Maudrell against E. Burnett for commission on the sale of the latter's ranch was dismissed, the evidence not showing clearly that the introduction of the purchase had been made through the efforts of the plaintiff. The only other contested matter was an action brought by Louise Genier against John Stuckey—a matter of accounts. Upon an adjustment, judgment was given for the plaintiff.
