

CAME BACK TO FORT

AUSTRIAN ON PAROLE ASKED TO BE MADE PRISONER AGAIN.

Said He Had Tramped All Over Canada and Could Not Get Work — Guard Placed Him in Custody Again — About Two Hundred War Prisoners.

An evidence that Germans and Austrians who are in Canada are "up against it" for the want of work, is shown in the fact that prisoners of war, who have been confined to Fort Henry, are glad to get back again after being allowed out on parole.

On Friday an Austrian, who is about forty years of age, appeared at the gate at Fort Henry and asked the guard who was on duty to take him in again. The request was granted.

A short time ago this man was released on parole, on condition that he would not leave Canada. When he arrived at the fort he stated that he had tried all over the country to get work, but he had been unable to get anything to do and for that reason the money which he had in his possession before he left the war prison is almost gone. He stated that he had made an endeavor to get a position on some of the steamers running in and out of Kingston, but he had been informed that all the positions were filled.

Other men who have been let out on parole have asked to be taken back.

Up until Saturday afternoon there were 199 prisoners inside the walls. The largest number at one time in confinement was 204. Eight of that number were released, but two arrived on Friday to make up the number.
