

ANOTHER IMPORTANT CAPTURE OF "WANTED" GERMANS.

Sought By Toronto Authorities—Caught Crossing Steel Arch Bridge.

A German giving the name of Paul Jockel, who was attempting to cross the upper steel arch bridge from the Canadian side, at 7:30 last night, was stopped on suspicion and arrested by O. P. Officer Kelly. This is believed to be one of the most important captures made recently. Paul Jockel, who was accompanied by his wife, has this morning been recognized as a man for whom the military authorities have been searching. He has been employed at a very high salary, named as over \$1700 a year, by a Toronto manufacturing firm. On what particular crime or suspicion Toronto wants him has not been divulged, but it is admitted that in arresting him Kelly has put his hand on a most important war prisoner. Jockel, when stopped, was in a fine automobile. He said he was visiting his father in Buffalo, and had come from Toronto, and that he would return within a week. The contents of his car and four grips in it all went to show that he was leaving the country altogether and not going out Buffalo on a short return trip slated. Further, his statement that he was a Belgian was disbelieved. He was handed over to the immigration department, who have passed him on to the armoury.
