

# CASE OF ALIEN ENEMY

## Regulations Will Furnish Means to Deal With Montreal

Ottawa, Oct. 29—The Montreal deputation which was to have waited on the Government tomorrow to present the special case of Montreal in regard to the presence of unemployed Austrian and German immigrants therein, will not come to Ottawa until next week. They will wait on the Cabinet probably on Monday or Friday.

It was stated in official circles today that when the regulations framed by order-in-council last night are put into effect, as they will be almost immediately, they will furnish the means to deal with the situation in Montreal as in other Canadian cities. Another meeting of the Cabinet Council was held today, when ways and means of enforcing these regulations were discussed. It was announced that registration will probably be supervised in the West by the Mounted Police and in Eastern Canada probably by the Dominion Police. The intention of the Government is not to intern a large number of these people, as has been stated, but rather to register all and provide work where possible. Some will be allowed to leave the country, others will be let go on parole, while a certain number will be interned.

It was stated in official circles that the King Edward Park Association of Montreal had offered the use of the grounds and buildings as a suitable headquarters for those Germans and Austrians who may be taken in charge by the Government.
