

# THE PROPOSED GERMAN ATTACK ON CANAL & TUNNEL

## C.P.R. DENY RUMOR.

At the Investigation Department of the Canadian Pacific Railway it was stated that there was absolutely no truth in the rumor of a pre-concerted attack by Germans or German sympathizers on the tunnel and bridges near Hamilton, and upon the Welland canal. On Sunday evening the C. P. R. despatched six special constables on the midnight train to Hamilton to do patrol duty in the vicinity of that city, but the men all returned yesterday morning to Toronto.

The report, which aroused the vigilance of the C. P. R. police, as well as the Hamilton city police, is supposed to have been sent to Ottawa from the United States, and was then passed on from the capital to the Canadian Pacific Company and to the city of Hamilton. Inspector Callow, of the C. P. R. Investigation Department, who left for Hamilton and Welland upon receipt of the news from Ottawa, wired to his office yesterday that the story of the plot was without foundation.
