

ALIEN REGISTRATION STARTS IN MONTREAL

Large German and Austrian
Colony There Will be
Rounded up

SIR WILLIAM OTTER BUSY

Goes to Metropolis to See
Capt. Carpenter go to
Work

Ottawa, Nov. 4.—Registration of alien enemies started in Montreal to-day where Capt. Silas H. Carpenter is in charge of the work.

General Sir William Otter, who is to have charge of this work as well as the work of internment of all prisoners of war, has gone to Montreal to consult with Chief Carpenter and to help get the registration started.

Montreal, which has probably the largest colony of Germans and Austrians, will be the first place where the system will be given a thorough trial. General Otter, whose appointment will be officially gazetted to-day, will make his headquarters in Toronto and will likely take charge of registration in that city, although so far Toronto has not been officially named.

For Niagara District.

Welland has been added to the list of registration places and will be the registration centre for all of the Niagara district where there are many Austrians and Germans. The registrar has not yet been named. The registrar for Fort William has also not yet been selected. It is very possible a registry office will be opened at Sault Ste. Marie or Sudbury for New Ontario.

In Western Canada the mounted police will have charge of registration. In Winnipeg Col. Sam Steele will personally look after the work. Inspector Jennings at Edmonton and Inspector Belcher at Regina.
