TURKISH COLONY RAIDED: HUNDRED TWENTY TAKEN

THEY WILL BE BROUGHT FROM BRANTFORD TO TORONTO — WERE NOT ACTIVE.

Brantford, Nov. 9.—The local police to-night made raids on the Turkish colony here, and, in batches, secured one hundred and twenty Turks, who were taken to the police station, and afterwards transferred to the county jail. The arrests were effected on orders from Colonel Sherwood, head of the Dominion Police at Ottawa. The Turks had not been active locally. They will be transferred as military prisoners to Toronto at the earliest opportunity.

MANY PUBLIC EXECUTIONS IN CONSTANTINOPLE

GREAT ANXIETY IN GOVERN MENTAL CIRCLES OVER ATTI-TUDE OF THE PEOPLE.

(Canadian Press Despatch)

Constantinople, Nov. 9.- There is a great degree of anxiety in Governmental circles regarding the attitude of certain sections of the people in Constantinople. An evidence of this is found in the activity of the courtsmartial.

The local police maintain a close surveillance over the population, and anyone expressing anti-Government views is immediately arrested and court-martialed. A considerable number of public executions have taken place in the last few days.
