THE SNYDERS REMANDED.

Their Counsel Obtains Till Friday to Prepare Defence,

(Special Despatch to The Globe,) Niagara Falls, Ont., Nov. 18 .- Magistrate Fraser remanded to-day the cases of Joseph Snyder, his son, Richard, and brother. Arthur, who are charged with treason in attempting to smuggle four Austrian reservists out of the country. The remand was taken at the request of D. B. White, counsel for the prisoners, who asked that the case be enlarged until Friday morning at 11 o'clock, as he had not yet obtained all the facts of the case. The accused were brought to the City Hall by an armed guard of eight militiamen. Four reservisis were also in court. After the cuse had been remanded the prisoners were returned to the Armory, although the case is now in the hands of the civil authorities.
